Planning applications

The construction of extension and garage, without compliance of Condition 3, of Decision Notice E2/06/01049/FUL dated 15.09.2006. At Brambles, Kellow, Looe.

So far this year, working on erosion estimates by the Coastal Protection Team, 6 years' worth of cliff erosion has taken place at Millendreath, currently the garages on the cliff are now just feet away from collapse. Councillor Lawes is monitoring the situation

Looe and The first King Charles

History Snippet by Jenny Wallis

King James1 is old. In 1622 he appointed his 'favourite', the Duke of Buckingham, as Administrator of Cornwall, sacking the incumbents and making enemies. Buckingham appoints James Bagg, a sycophantic logistics guru as his agent - with access to lucrative naval funds and commissions. The King was trying to get a treaty with Spain by marrying his son, Charles, to the Infanta of Spain. Since Britain was now Protestant, Catholic Europe was no longer willing to liaise with Barbary Pirates to collect ransom money and repatriate captives. - (which was encouraging people-stealing!). Infanta refuses marriage offer. James declares war on Spain. Parliament agrees to send a fleet to Newfoundland to deal with complaints of piracy on the high seas - hopefully capturing Spanish treasure ships. 27th March 1625 James1 dies and his laws are sidelined.

King Charles1 is taken in hand by the **Duke of Buckingham.** By 1st May **1625** he was married to **Henrietta Maria of France** (aged 15) although he sent a proxy to the ceremony as he was not a Catholic. They finally met in June!

In **1624**, **James Bagg** inherited his father's privateering and customs interests in Plymouth and Saltram House. He was granted **£300,000** of parliamentary aid to equip the navy for the **war with Spain**. He moved to Looe and bought **Killigarth** for £3000. With **Buckingham** as his protector and patron he was elected **MP for West Looe** with 11 votes. (NB There were only 9 voters!) He was now Commissioner

for Piracy in Devon, Collector of Admiralty Tithes, Vice Admiral of Cornwall, Commissioner to Press Seamen, Deputy Mayor of Plymouth. - loyal servant of the Crown! In **1625 James Bagg** is appointed **Victualler of the Fleet** with powers to impress 10,000 seamen from Devon and Cornwall. **John Mohun of Boconnoc** 'befriends' **James Bagg**, hoping for a knighthood and James Bagg becomes **MP for East Looe**. Sleaze, fraud, embezzlement, false witness, profiteering and bribery result, in **1626**, to the mayor of Looe, **William Mayowe**, imprisoning Mohun's agent. - and **Mohun** arresting the Mayor for debt!

In September 1625, King Charles and Buckingham visit Plymouth and James Bagg is knighted! Cadiz was not captured as the victuals were past their sell-by date and 4,000 seamen died of food poisoning. So Sir James had to provide for the sick and impress 4000 more seamen!. In 1625 press men were in Cornwall. In 1626 Looe was short of 60 men! Sir James had bagged 14,000 local seamen plus 5000 for the Newfoundland fleet. He was dubbed BOTTOMLESS BAGG.

Parliament had loaned the French some ships to subdue Protestant **asylum seekers** in La Rochelle to prevent them crossing the Channel

(in small boats!). **Buckingham** was criticised and **Bagg** spoke up for him. **Buckingham** was being investigated in the **Court of the Star Chamber** for **taking the knee** before a Catholic altar during eucharist! (post Tudor Brexit).

Buckingham was assassinated in 1628. **Bagg** was taken to the **Star Chamber** by **Mohun** for embezzling £80,000 - But nothing was proved. Killigarth was re-possessed and life in Looe went on as usual!

The Cornish Chough

Cornwall – where waves crash against ancient rocks, a winged legend with red legs and a red bill once soared with majestic grace.

Yes, we are referring to the Cornish Chough, a symbol of Cornwall featured on the Coat of Arms, signifying untamed beauty and resilience. Once a common sight in the Britain county, the red-legged chough with coal-black feathers captivated the hearts of locals and wanderers alike. However, over the years, chough sightings have decreased drastically, almost to the brink of oblivion.

About Cornish Choughs

The Cornish chough thrives in short grasslands and coastal heathlands. Member of the crow family, it skillfully probes the earth with its lengthy, red beak in search of insects, like beetle larvae and leatherjackets. Displaying remarkable aerial acrobatics, it emits a distinctive "chee-ow" vocalisation,





resembling that of a Jackdaw but louder in volume.

When it comes to nesting, choughs form small colonies and choose cliff faces, rock ledges, fissures, crevices, and even abandoned structures as their abodes. They construct their nests using roots, stems, and heather while lining the cosy interior with wool or hair.

The female chough lays a clutch of three to five eggs, and both parents actively participate in nurturing the hatchlings, ensuring their wellbeing and growth.

That said, to accurately recognise a Cornish chough, note that it may be 38-40 cm long and boast a wingspan of 82 cm. They mostly weigh 310 grams and live for about seven years.

Return Of The Chough

For many years, conservation organisations have dedicated their efforts towards securing a suitable habitat and nest site for the chough.

In 2001, a small group of four wild choughs occurred in west Cornwall, and three of them decided to make it their home. This raised hopes that they would remain in the area and breed further.

The delightful news arrived in early 2002 when a pair of birds initiated the nesting process. By mid-April, they had built a concealed nest within a sea cave, out of sight from prying eyes. The female chough had commenced incubating a clutch of eggs – the first successful breeding of choughs in Cornwall (and England) in half a century!

The Cornwall Chough Project was established through the collaborative efforts of the National Trust, the RSPB, the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, and English Nature. Building upon existing initiatives, its primary objective was to facilitate the return of the chough to Cornwall.

Another old recipe from the Farmer's Weekly collection. They really are a wonderful source of excellent traditional recipes. Those of you who have followed me for many years will know I love ginger, in any form, but particularly crystallised! But come to think of it, any ginger.



You will need a 2 lb loaf tin, as I used, but equally good in a 7 inch round. Pre heat your fan oven to 160C

Ingredients

5 oz crystallised or stem ginger 8 oz SR flour 6 oz butter, softened 1/2 teaspoonful vanilla extract

- 4 oz dried or glacé cherries 6 oz caster sugar 3 eggs
- 1 tablespoonful milk

Cherry Ginger Cake

Method

First chop your ginger into very small pieces, reserving a few larger bits to decorate the top later on.

Halve the cherries and toss the fruit in a little flour.

In a mixing bowl, cream the butter and sugar, then whisk in the eggs, alternatively with the flour.

Add the vanilla and milk and mix well.

Tip into your prepared tin and bake for about 45 mins, then turning down your oven to 140C for a further 20 mins.

Cool, then if you wish, make a water icing with icing sugar and decorate with more cut halves of cherries and ginger.

Cornwall Council is thanking everyone who has contributed to planting the Forest for Cornwall which has now reached a million trees. Since the community planting programme started five years ago volunteers, businesses, farmers, community

The Forest for Cornwall now spans approximately 1,000 hectares across woodland, parks, community spaces, gardens and farms, increasing nature for residents and absorbing CO2 emissions to slow climate change.

Becoming a Parish Councillor

Full Parish Council elections are held every four years. But from time to time, vacancies may be available as councillors retire or resign. Qualifications for standing for election

To be able to stand as a candidate at a parish council election in England or a community council election in Wales you must:

• be at least 18 years old

• be a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any member state of the European Union, and

• meet at least one of the following four qualifications:

a. You are, and will continue to be, registered as a local government elector for the parish/community in which you wish to stand from the day of your nomination onwards.

b. You have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish/community area during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.

c. Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of your nomination and the day of election has been in the parish/ community area.

d. You have lived in the parish/community area or within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election. Cont:next pg



Disqualifications


Apart from meeting the qualifications for standing for election, you must also not be disqualified. There are certain people who are disqualified from being elected to a parish or community council in England and Wales. You cannot be a candidate if at the time of your nomination and on polling day:

a. You are employed by the parish/community council or hold a paid office under the parish/community council (including joint boards or committees).

b. You are the subject of a bankruptcy restrictions order or interim order.

c. You have been sentenced to a term of imprisonment of three months or more (including a suspended sentence), without the option of a fine, during the five years before polling day.

d. You have been disqualified under the Representation of the People Act 1983 (which covers corrupt or illegal electoral practices and offences relating to donations). Cont:next pg



The disqualification for an illegal practice begins from the date the person has been reported guilty by an election court or convicted and lasts for three years. The disqualification for a corrupt practice begins from the date a person has been reported guilty by an election court or convicted and lasts for five years.

Being a Parish Councillor

As part of their preparation for taking an active role in the Parish Council, all Councillors need to undergo a period of induction. This will give them the opportunity to learn more about the way in which the Parish Council works, what its obligations and legal responsibilities are and how they can make the best use of their time as a councillor.
